I have served on many boards and helped raise money as campaign chairman for many organizations including United Ways and Arts Organizations across the state including Bamberg, Columbia, Hartsville, and Spartanburg. But got the best thrills out along with others of helping to found The Spartanburg Residential Development Corporation and serving as its treasurer for 12 years. We along with the other officers of the corporation got 8 banks to agree to make at least 3 loans a year to low and moderate income home buyers at favorable terms such as low down payments and below market interest rates. Each bank took its applications and approved their own loans. The borrower had to have a job with enough income to make the payment plus pay their other regular bills and payments. The total of this loan payment plus other loan payments could not exceed 37%/38% of gross monthly income. They had to have a good credit bureau report of good payment records. After 12 years, together we put over 250 families in homes. In 1957, I was voted the Most Valuable Player by my teammates on my high school football team as a Senior running back at Swansea High School. We lost only one game that year. I played baseball at Furman. In 1960, I lead the Southern Conference in stolen bases. It was a good year!
